Welcome

A big welcome to our new children and their families this term: Bertie, Sophie D, Elsie C, James R, Wilf, Eva, Oona, Jack, Lottie and Abigail. We look forward to working with you and hope you enjoy your time with us.

We have two classes in nursery, Bears and Cubs. Bears are children who will start primary school in September 2023 and Cubs are children who will start primary school in September 2024 or 2025. Bears start the day in the smaller classroom and Cubs start the day in the "big" classroom ie the chapel building.



Primary Schools

For those children who start their primary education in September, you should have been offered a place at your choice of school. Each primary school will be offering taster sessions. Please let us know if your child will be absent or needs collecting early. We have invited all reception class teachers from our feeder primary schools into nursery to meet the children in their familiar environment. This year we have 27 children leaving us in July and we would like to ensure as smooth a transition as possible for them. We have set up two meetings for parents about starting school, see details below.

Forest Schools

Forest School sessions have been offered to those children who start primary school in September on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons for five weeks. These sessions started last week and got off to a flying start. Sarah Capper is our forest schools trained leader and she is leading these sessions.

Please note that the forest school group does not get back to nursery until 3pm.



Getting ready for school meeting

In order to make the transistion to Primary School as easy as possible for our children we have bought them all a "Buddy Bear." The Bear will go with them to primary school but before then we will be planning activities around the bears to introduce the children to the idea of "Big School."

All parents of children going to primary school this September 2023 are invited to a meeting either on Wednesday 3rd May at 2pm or Thursday 4th May at 6.30pm. We will talk about the Buddy Bear project and about how to help your child with the move to primary school.

Parent: teacher meetings

Parent:teacher meetings will be held on Wednesday 24th May 8am-5pm, Thursday 25th May from 2pm to 6pm and Friday 26th May from 8am to 12pm. You can book an appointment by calling or e-mailing us. This is a good opportunity to have a chat with us about your child's progress and about any concerns you may have about your child starting primary school. These meetings are for the parents of ALL children, not just the children going to school this September.

School Photographer

The school photographer will be in nursery on Tuesday 23rd May from 8:30am. As always, family groups and older/youger siblings are very welcome. If you are not usually in nursery on a Tuesday you are still welcome to come and have your photo taken. Group photos will be taken during the morning Please let Mrs Brown know if you would prefer your child not to have an individual photo or to be included in the group photo.

School trip to Crich Tramway museum

I have booked a school trip to Crich Tramway museum on Wednesday 21st June. We will leave nursery at 9.15am, arriving about 10 am. Children in Bears class will be accompanied by staff but children in Cubs class will need to be accompanied by an adult. Nursery will be closed on this day as all staff will be on the trip. All children are welcome on this trip even if they don't usually attend nursery on Wednesdays. I will send out a separate letter about this with details and instructions about how to complete the permission form on Parent Pay. The trip is free to children but we will need a contribution from accompanying adults.

Governors Section

You may not be aware that we have to pay DCC for the school dinner service. Due to ongoing budget cuts to nursery schools the governors have taken the very difficult decision not to buy into this service from September. Therefore all children will need to bring a packed lunch from September if they are staying all day.

Our Governors visit school regularly to monitor various aspects of school life and school improvement. They carry out visits to school to monitor the curriculum, health and safety, provision for children with SEND (special educational needs and disabilities), safeguarding, the school improvement plan and to carry out headteacher performance management. Governors are also responsible for ensuring that children's progress and standards of achievement are high and hold the headteacher to account for standards in school.

We have a vacany for a co-opted Governor. If you or anyone you know is interested in joining our friendly and very effective Governing Body then please let us know. They don't have to be a parent, it could be anyone in our community.
